

# STIs and BBVs: What sort of risks are young people taking?



YEP Project Annual Youth Survey Findings 2024

#### Types of unprotected sex

Of young people surveyed aged 15-25:




70% had contact with genitals without a barrier method



65% had unprotected oral sex



40% had unprotected vaginal sex



25% had unprotected anal sex



18% shared sex toys with another person/people without using a barrier method (i.e. condom, dam)


#### Risk behaviours for blood borne virus



48% Shared a toothbrush or razor with others



26% had unprotected oral, vaginal or anal sex whilst someone is on their period



15% had a collision whist playing sport that resulted in bleeding



10% shared piercing equipment (e.g. needle, jewellery) with others outside of a professional piercing studio



8% got a tattoo overseas



5% shared tattoo equipment (e.g. needle, ink, paper towel) with others outside of a professional tattoo studio

#### **Getting Tested**


42% of young people surveyed have had a sexual health test before.



41% of those have had a sexual health test in the last year.






#### There is no 'one STI test that detects them all'

Different sexually transmitted infections (STI's) and blood borne viruses (BBV's) are tested using different methods.




**THROAT SWAB** 

Can test for: Chlamydia Gonorrhoea




**ANAL SWAB** 

Can test for: Chlamydia Gonorrhoea



**BLOOD TEST** 

Can test for: HIV, Syphilis and Hepatitis A, B & C



**VAGINAL SWAB** 

Can test for: Chlamydia Gonorrhoea



**URINE SAMPLE** 

Can test for: Chlamydia Gonorrhoea



**LESION SWAB** 

Can test for: Herpes Syphilis



# Why young people avoided getting tested

- 1 I'm too shame
- I'm too scared
- I don't think I'm at risk
- Have not had a new sexual partner in the last year
- I don't want people to see my body or swab me
- Have not had a new sexual partner in the last year
- I don't want my parent/s or caregiver to know
- 8 No one I know gets them
- I don't like getting a blood test
- It's weird or not normal amongst my peers
- I don't want my friend/s to know
- I can't afford it or it's too expensive

"Just procrastinating it."



## Why young people got tested

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- A health professional (like a doctor) suggested or referred me
- I was showing symptoms which I thought might be an STI
- A friend sharing they had gotten tested, encouraging me to
- A partner / someone I was sleeping with sharing they got tested / encouraging me to
- Sex ed at school
- Something I saw on social media
- Someone I slept with tested positive for an STI or BBV










# Factors that makes getting tested easier or more comfortable for young people

- Education about what testing includes
- Hearing peers/ friend's experiences
- Free STI/BBV testing
- Youth friendly sexual health clinic
- A GP that initiates conversations about sexual health/ testing
- Low cost STI/BBV testing
- Sexual health clinic that is accessible to your needs
- A clinic closer to you/ moving closer to a clinic
