



Participants








- N=114

Gender Identity






Gender identity




Sexual and Romantic Attraction






Sexual or romantic attraction to more than one gender



- 34.86% of participants had engaged in sexual experiences with more than one gender (4.59% declined to answer)
- 57.8% of participants had experienced sexual or romantic attraction to more than one gender (2.57% decline to answer)

Sexual experiences with more than one gender




Cultural and Linguistic Diversity










 23.15% identified as culturally and linguistically diverse

Disability








- 21.1% of participants identified as living with a disability

Region










 7.34% of participants lived in regional or remote WA

Limitations in Diversity










- 0% of participants identified as Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander

Do you prefer having a young person deliver sexual health information, rather than by adults alone?




56.44% of participants agreed








Have you been to a sexual health clinic or service in the last year?








Have you had an STI or BBV check/test in the last year?

Participants were given the opportunity to comment on their STI testing experiences.


Qualitative responses included:

- "Positive GP STI tests, terrible cell removal experience at specialist clinic"
- "I used to have hep C, that is cleared. I have also had chlamydia and gonorrhea in the past. No STIs were present this time. Because my safety in sex is more important to me now that my mental health has improved and I have been better educated"
- "Positive: Drop-in service, no judgement, answered all my questions, bulk billed. Negative: 4/5 hours wait"
- "When I had it, I was scared but felt comfortable enough even with a male old man doctor"





If you had an STI or BBV check/test in the last year how youth friendly do you think the services was?



What youth sexual health topics would you like to know more about?


