







Ages of Participants

- 25% of respondents identified as living with a disability




 14.6% of respondents identify as trans or gender diverse












Participants Sexual Behaviours






Unprotected oral sex (without a condom or dam)

Unprotected anal sex (without a condom)


Shared sex toys with another person/people without using a barrier method (i.e. condom, dam)

Not interested in dating at all












Responses to receiving sexual health information from a qualified young person over an adult






Sources of Sexual Health Information



If you had a sexually transmitted infection (STI) or blood-borne virus (BBV) check/test in the last year, what was included in the test?












Why Young People Avoided Getting Tested



I'm too shame I'm too scared I don't think Im at risk Have not had a new sexual partner in the last year (in a long term relationship) I don't want people to see my body or swab me Have not had a new sexual partner in the last year (Not sexually active in the last year) I don't want my parent/s or caregiver to know No one I know gets them I don't like getting a blood test It's weird or not normal amongst my peers I don't want my friend/s to know I can't afford it or it's too expensive I don't want my partner/s to know I don't think the service is LGBTQIA+ safe/friendly It is weird or not normal It's hard to get there My mental health affected my ability to attend

Something I saw on social media











Where Would You Go To Get A STI/BBV Test?






I think that my knowledge of sexual health and BBV issues has increased in the last year

I feel that I had an informative and positive sexual health education experience at school


I feel that I am able to discuss sexual health, sexuality, and sexual experiences with my parents











Have You Heard Of The YEP Project Before The Survey?






How Participants Connected with The YEP Project






Intersectionality
